HOW TO USE THIS BOOK

This collection of random tables is meant to help gamemasters run espionage, noir, gangster, and cosmic horror tabletop role-playing games. These are simple tables intended to cut down GM prep and add flavor details to adventures.

The first section is comprised of names. Players always ask the names of non-player characters, especially ones the gamemaster just made up on the spot. With these tables, you will never get caught without a period name.

The next section is focused on items. Provided is a list of fictional ancient texts that could be used in your cosmic horror games. Items in a room and a desk are included because players search everything and it is usually unsatisfying to tell a player there is nothing when they search.

In the people section, you can find the names of famous people from the time period. These names allow you to complete the feel of the world and add realism to your games. Also, provided are period jobs that can be assigned to NPCs.

The media section contains movie titles, songs, and radio shows. These add period-correct details to sessions as the GM could note what song is playing on the radio or what movies are showing at the theater.

The places section lists two hundred ghost towns throughout the United States. These can be used in a number of ways. The towns could be the location of strange events or mysteries. They could be used as meeting places or hiding places. Of course, the list goes on and on.

In the rumors section, there are ideas and hooks for situations the characters could overhear or learn about. The table is general enough to be used for various genres like noir, cosmic horror, mobsters, or spies.

The slang section is a bit different. The items listed here are not random tables instead, they are a glossary of terms used in the 1920s-1930s. These can be used to lend authenticity to the game by helping the GM and players speak like the people of the time period.

Whether you are beating back cosmic horrors or bootlegging or sneaking documents out of Nazi Germany or investigating a crime on the depression-era streets of Los Angeles, these random tables will help everything seem more real.

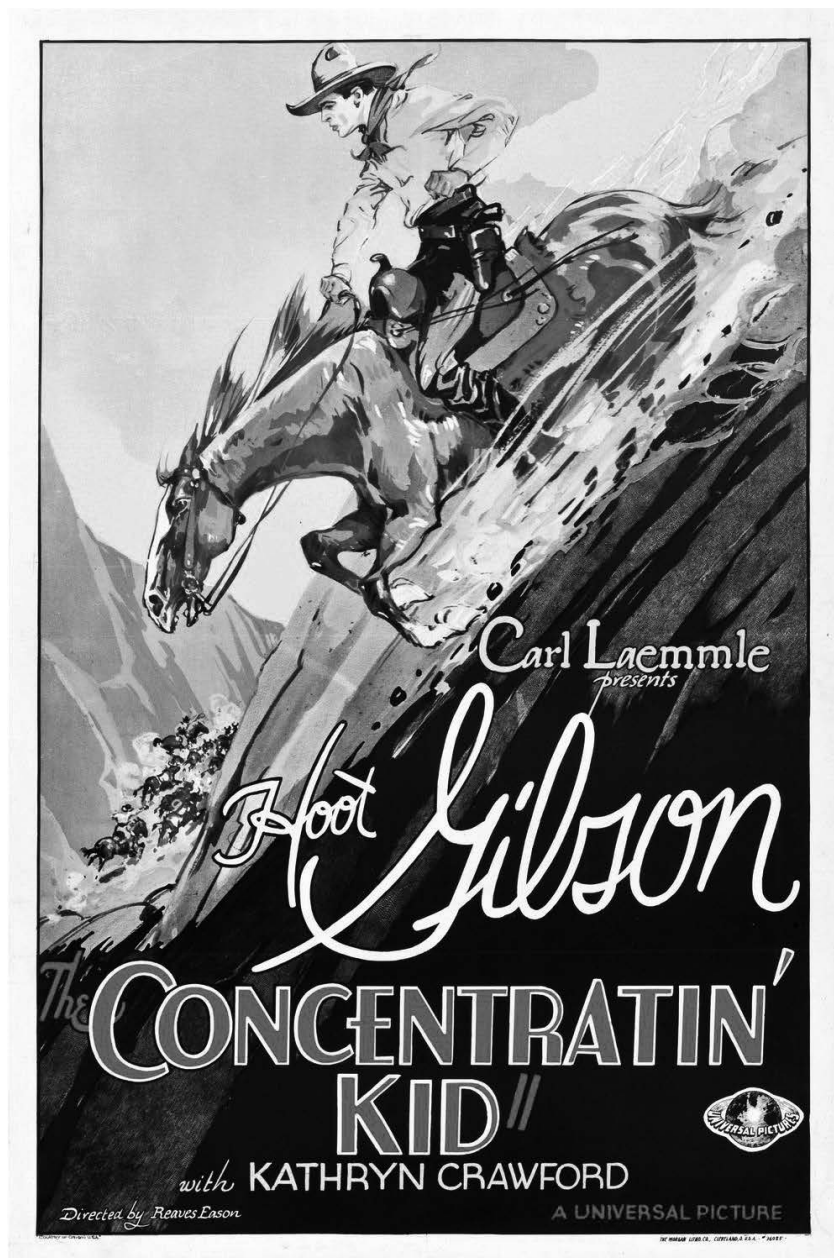

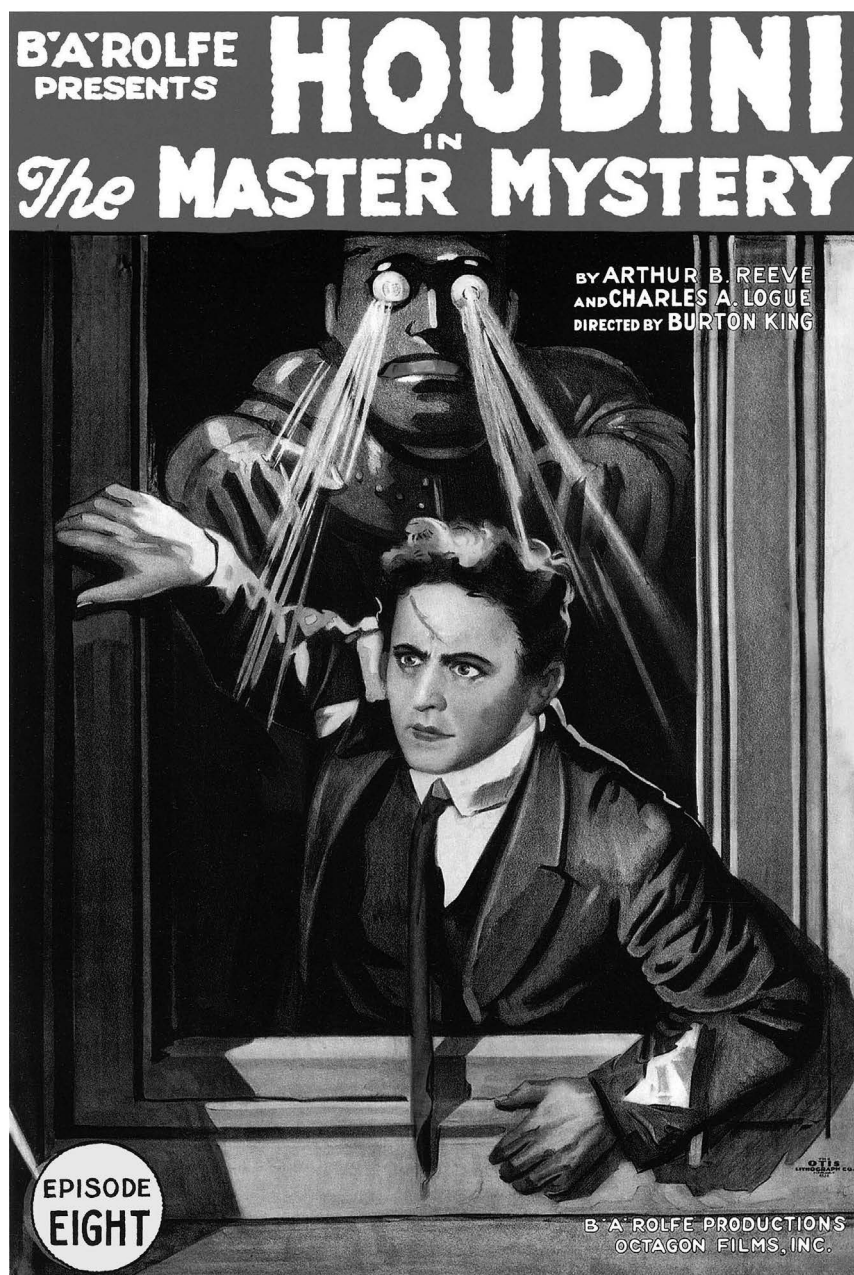

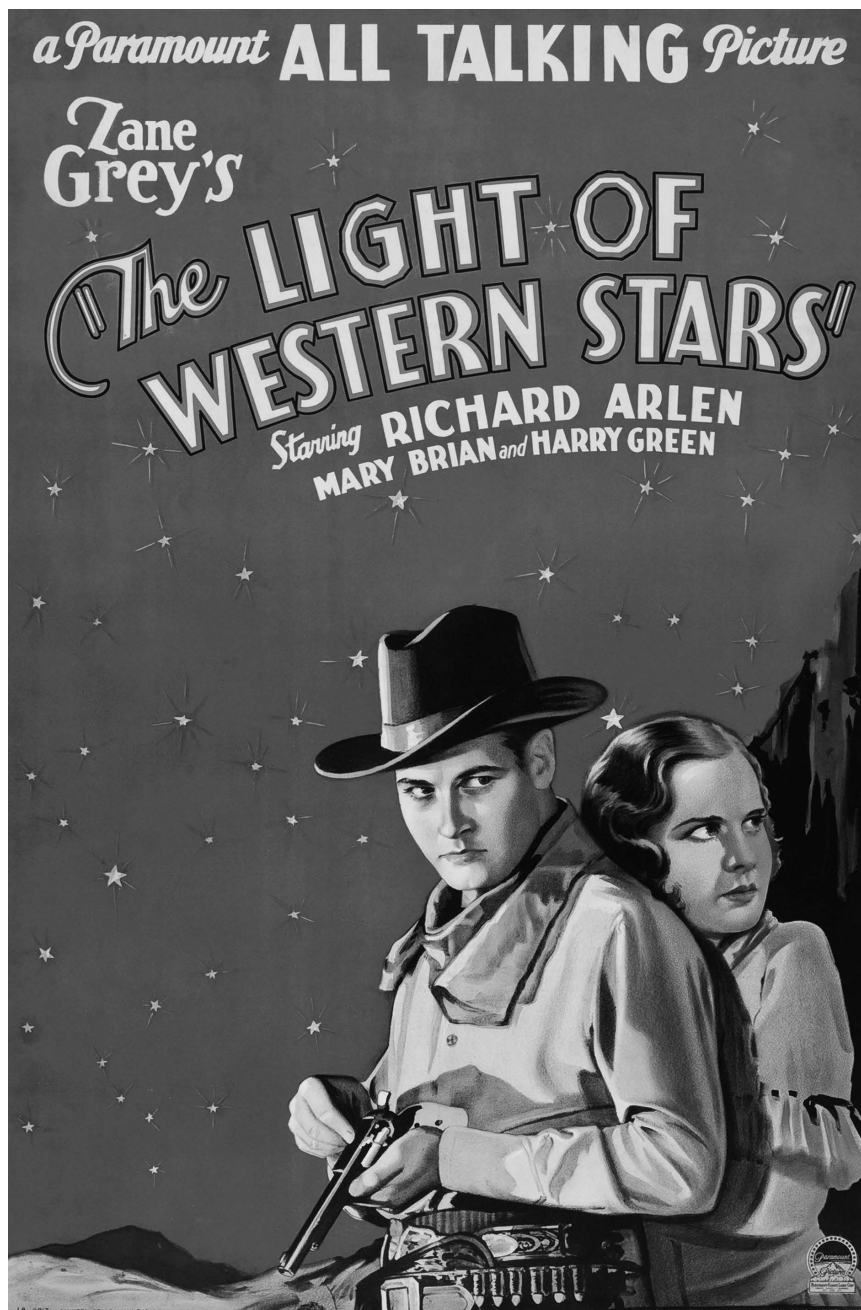
