# How To Use This Book

This book in the Books of Random Tables series is geared toward fun pulp from the 1920s and 1930s. Random tables help game masters add details and give players interesting play options.

These random tables can be used in several different ways. The game master can use them during session prep. The game master can roll on the tables during the session or have the players roll. The game master could also simply choose items from the lists, but there is a magic in the randomness of dice.

Like the other books in the series, this one is broken into sections.

The first section is Items & Things. Here are helpful tables for when players wish to search every room or location from top to bottom. Also, some tables include period items as well. These add a touch of realism to the RPG.

The next is Trains. Lots of pulp adventures involved trains. These tables offer insight for GMs when crafting a train adventure or rolling one up from scratch with train cars and historic rail lines.


The Names section contains a variety of names from the time period as well as names for NPCs. Find tables with common names from the era and fictional big game hunters, mobsters, and more.




